#### 13.1 The 106th UWA Student Guild.

13.1.1 Recognises the racism and division fostered by the extremist groups and opposes its extremist ideology both internationally, in Australia and on campus at UWA.

13.1.2 Recognises that the growth of extremist ideology is linked to decades of racism normalised by the political mainstream.

13.1.3 Recognises that the rise of the extremist ideology has gone hand-in-hand with the intensification of islamophobia and antisemitism as seen in recent terrorist attacks (e.g. Christchurch and Poway).

13.1.4 Directs Ethnocultural Collective and Public Affairs Council to work together to oppose racism and the extremist ideology on campus. This includes, but is not limited to:

13.1.4.1 Promoting and empowering cultural clubs on campus to host culturally immersive events for students to immerse themselves in different cultures to reduce cultural ignorance and prevent racism.

13.1.4.2 To continue to work closely with the university to oppose racism on campus.
