- Brief summary:

- 1393 Students have lodged 26716 hours.

- GV connecting students to community, over 60% hours, around 16760 hours committed through Guild Volunteering programs. Student run and student-led programs. The rest were run by the staff or in collaboration with various stakeholders.
 - Full reports will be made available in the Committee Teams folder.
 - JL asks if we could have year-on-year comparison with the last year (2023), in terms of how the hours may be differ or achievements.
 - JR is happy to put together some information from last year and do some comparison. However, considering some programs are still running, it might not reflect the right number. Also, JR mentions that total hours might not reflect the impact necessarily.
- **Guild Gardens**
