will discuss improvements to parking that include introduction of online parking (i.e. similar to cellopark app), reallocation of underutilised bays and reallocation of red bays after hours)

Campus Activation Semester 2

In collaboration with SOC, Welfare, Guild events and Prisha Goel, we are looking to hold regular events to help activate campus. Events include but not limited to bouncy castle, bubble soccer, free icecream. We are looking to partner with different clubs each week via SOC to increase reach and ensure the most people benefit from this. We have created a list of event and hoping to start this in Week 3 or 4.

Ongoing Club overdrafts

Working with Guild Finance to chase up club overdrafts is unfortunately still ongoing from 2021. Emails have been sent out however with little success. We will be looking at alternative ways to chase up these clubs and close this chapter for good.

Sponsorship Committee

Our mission of getting better sponsors for UWA Guild & clubs is underway. The sponsorship committee has been formed and a goal setting meeting took place. Aidan and I are still currently working on the Guild prospectus before we have a larger committee meeting to tackle the remaining tasks.

Improvements to QE2 campus

Looking to run a survey within the medical and dental school and see what improvements can be made to the student experience on these campuses. Hoping to introduce more shaded areas and longer outlet opening hours. Have contacted Caitlin in creating a survey and are in the process of developing the questions.

Perth Wildcats x UWA Student Guild

Looking to develop a working relationship with the Perth Wildcats, and hoping to bring them to campus on semester 2 to increase student engagement. Have had a few initial phone calls and meetings with wildcats executives and will be looking to solidify some plans for semester 2 very soon.

Producing Financial Material (temporarily ceased)

After discussions with the Guild Finance staff, we can confirm we are not allowed legally to produce financial material regarding SSAF. We will look at other means of increasing student's financial literacy.

Q-Pay Platform (Ceased)

Over the last 1.5 months, conversations have been had with Q-Pay with the prospect of bringing them on as the official UWA Ticketing Platform. However, given the current financial situation, it is unlikely we will be progressing further with this and will be looking at alternatives.

ACCESS DEPARTMENT GUILD COUNCIL REPORT 23/07/2022

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This month was incredibly busy for the Access Department. We have been working very hard on our projects, including Auslan Classes Program, Wellbeing Volunteering Program and the Anti-Vaping Campaign. Access Week is fast approaching so our committee has been working hard to ensure the events they oversee will be a success. We have also been planning events such as Guild on the Green as well as our collaboration event with Science Union.

MEETINGS ATTENDED

Date	Meeting	Purpose
29/06/2022	Equity and Diversity Meeting	In this meeting, each department gave an update on where their projects pertaining to equity and diversity are at. The Access Department gave an update on our projects and also asked for advice on how we can get the university to respond and help with the issue of Access UWA Students' Voting Rights. Dana also brought up the issue of the structure of the Master of Clinical Neuropsychology and Doctor of Philosophy course and how the course overloads students with work. We discussed how we can get help changing the structure of the course.
30/06/2022	UniAccess x Access Department meeting	This meeting was with Liz and Hayley from UniAccess. We discussed business cases for several projects, the issues with the Master of Clinical Neuropsychology course and what options we have to suggest changes to the course, and touched on the progress of the Accessibility Audit of UWA. UniAccess discussed the obstacle report of UWA, which they will send to our department to read through and they had asked if we have a student in mind who could speak on the impact of covid on their education.

06/07/2022	TLR Student Reference Group	This meeting consisted of Patricia giving us a progress update, specifically an update on service uptake for quarter 2, and wellbeing engagement activities. Most of the meeting was in the discussion of TLR pop-up spaces, the location and time; staffing requirements; wellbeing activities and consent, privacy and

		confidentiality required to run them. We ended the meeting with a brief chat about the theme weeks coming up in semester 2 and how TLR could help.
09/07/2022	Access Department Committee Bonding	Our committee got together to bond over some pizza in the Access Department room. We wrote letters to our future selves and tried out our planned Guild on the Green activity of decorating coasters. We had a fantastic time!
12/07/2022	Dana and HPU	Dana met with Kasey to discuss the Fit for Study Program. Access was hoping to get an outreach stall at Access Week, but the program has been dissolved into HPU. However, we will be getting them to do a sleep intervention stall.

PROJECT UPDATE

Guild on the Green

Guild on the Green was a great success! Our department made a little Mindfulness through Art stall where people can learn more information about us and take 10 minutes out of their busy schedule to sit down and decorate some rocks and coasters with us. We had a lot of engagement with this stall, where people were sitting down, chatting, and making friends! We had at least sixty people come down to our stall and engage with the activity so we will keep continuing with accessible Mindfulness through Art sessions like this.

Access Week

Our committee has been working tirelessly on Access Week. EMPs are in progress for all of our events, and we are currently securing speakers, venues et cetera.

Anti-Vaping Campaign

Dana has been heading this project. So far, the University has agreed to update the website, but no progress has been made in that aspect. This issue has also been conveyed to HPU and per their suggestion, it will be brought up in the Safer Communities Working Group. Moreover, Dana is awaiting a response from the Minderoo Foundation as they already have a campaign on this issue and have worked extensively in the Eastern States' campaigns.

Auslan Classes

We believe that it has been long overdue in having an Auslan program at UWA, especially as an educational institution. The UWA Student Guild has developed one of the best campus cultures in Australia. What lacks in our campus culture is the inclusivity and active participation of people from the Access community, especially students who are hard of hearing.

This program would aim to teach UWA students Auslan and for them to actively use what they have learnt in events, stalls and programs but to also teach other UWA students.

There are also many students who are hard of hearing but never had the chance to learn Auslan. They will be prioritised to learn Auslan under our program as they have lived experience and cultural understanding of the community which is valuable.

This program will open up career possibilities for students who are both hearing and hard of hearing.

Access Plus' WA Deaf Society have a Basic and Intermediate Auslan course. In this semester we are looking to run basic Auslan classes first and introduce the intermediate Auslan course in Semester 1 of 2023. An Auslan Program Director position will be introduced to the Access Department, so there is a dedicated person who will ensure the sustainability as well as the funding, and coordination of this program continues.

The Auslan course will be run over 8 weeks (2 hours per week) and includes Deaf Awareness Training (which usually costs \$495 by itself). The Access Department will also run practice sessions for 2 hours per week so the students involved in the program may practice what they have learnt for the week.

Access Wellbeing Volunteers

Our campaigns director, Jit, and Melani have been working hard on creating a new position within the Wellbeings Volunteer group. This position will be held by an existing member of the group. They will be provided with disability first aid training to upskill themselves and to create a more understanding environment at major Guild events. Melani, Dana, and Jit will be meeting with Clare and Sarah-Kate from Guild Volunteering to fine tune the program and publish the applications for this position. We are incredibly

grateful to Jenny Ophel and Tony Goodman who agreed to fund the training of our Wellbeing Volunteers for Semester 2. Thank you very much, Jenny and Tony!

Fresher Representative and Ordinary Committee Member applications

Since the end of Semester One, two of our directors have graduated from university and we had to say goodbye to them. We thank them for the great work they had done and their time with the Access Department has been invaluable. We now have two new directors who had stepped up from their OCM roles in our committee.

We also released the Ordinary Committee Member and Fresher Representative applications on the 14th of July, so we are looking forward to welcoming some new members to our committee soon!

'SU x Access // Education1001: UAAP, Spec Con and More' Event

Science Union and our department had planned this event to educate students to learn more about their rights and the range of support available.

We specifically covered the rights of the students, a step-by-step guide of Special Consideration, a step-by-step guide to applying for University Academic Adjustment Plans (UAAP), a step-by-step guide to academic reviews and appeals and a list of wellbeing services available on campus and off campus. This collaboration was planned to be held later in the semester, however, we had to move it forward due to scheduling difficulties. To improve engagement, we will try and establish a date earlier so there's adequate time to advertise. Overall, it was a great event, and we thank Science Union for this collaboration!

Access UWA Students' Voting Rights

It has been difficult getting in touch with the university about this issue. I have reached out to Donald Mwathi who is the executive assistant of the university secretariat and let them know about the inquiries we send through.

Georgie McDaid and our department have been in communication about bringing these topics up in an upcoming meeting with other disability office bearers. We are hoping to start a national campaign for both issues if we can't get them resolved in other ways.

Over May and June, the PSA was focused on preparing delivering support to postgraduate students through our funding of postgraduate workshops and grants. It was decided by the committee to postpone our monthly networking event, the PSA Connect, until June 16th to allow a majority of postgraduate coursework students to complete exams prior to the event. Given the easing of recent Covid-19 restrictions, the committee is excited at the prospect of hosting more students, as the previous PSA Connect reached capacity early in the event, subsequently leaving students queued up for extended periods of time. PSA is continuing to minimise its environmental impact created by ensuring sufficient recycling facilities are present.

Safe Clubs and Events Officer – In collaboration with the Women's Department SOC has been working on creating a new position on clubs to help implement strategies to combat sexual violence and harassment. This position, Safe Clubs and Events Officer (SCE Officer) is launching this month in a trial format.

02/07	Abortion Rights Protest	Protest went very well. I'm hopeful and encouraged by the size and strength of this ongoing campaign.
03/07	Women's Department Planning Day	Great day! I was very happy with this planning day, and we were able to set out a plan for the coming semester and review our work in semester 1. The team was really engaged and productive throughout the day and it was also good to spend the day together.
10/07	Women's Department Executive Meeting	This was a quick meeting to hear a few time- sensitive updates from myself and the Events Deputy Officer. Most discussion surrounded our Careers Event in Semester 2.
13/07	SOC President	Met with Jak again to go over the outline of the SCE Officer and again work on the launch of the initiative in Semester 2. We finalised our needs for student training at this

		meeting which was then organised with HPU.
13/07	Guild Marketing	Met with Caitlin to discuss creating posters for the promotion of security services around campus. Caitlin was very helpful and keen to work on this with me. We also touched on social media posts for when the SCE position is launched.
19/07	Nicole McEwen	Met with Nicole to discuss what is coming up in the Abortion Rights campaign. We discussed how to best promote the petition and the rally at parliament on the 29 th . Was a productive meeting.
19/07	Pride Officer	Met with Paris to discuss two main projects: the representation of gender diverse students as well as the guild complaints project. We made significant progress on both of these projects and set out clear action items.

PROJECT UPDATE

Malaysia University Project

I received a disappointing email from the National Malaysia University a week or so ago saying that they would have to postpone their visit which was scheduled for September. They have had adjustments in their managements and some other changes which have meant that the group aren't able to come in only a few months. They suggested coming in December but I let them know my concerns with this and am awaiting a response.

Sexual Misconduct Declaration

Tony did hear back from Legal and they were open to discussing it (and said that they actually had done in the past) but that they had some concerns with equity for all students. Tony seems to think this will be a difficult and long process but I have told him I am more than happy to talk to them with a student perspective.

Promotion of Security Services

CCTV promotion material is up in the libraries and Guild Marketing are kindly working on some posters with myself and Head of Campus Security. We also have Ghanshyam coming in tonight to talk to everyone about security services which is great.

Non-binary representation

Still working with Paris on this. She decided against forming the advisory student group to facilitate the process. We decided that the comments and feedback we have already had from students is sufficient to take action. I have created a post to be looked over by Paris, met with Rashdina about the process of changing Women's regulations, and we are discussing importance of this with council tonight (as Women's Dept is not the only group holding events for women students).

Guild Complaints Reporting Process

Paris and I had a good conversation about this initiative and decided against the process we originally had been following. Happy to discuss this further with anyone who is interested. We are planning to hopefully make some adjustments to the website on the discrimination page and outline students' options.

SCE Officer Initiative

We have completed everything we need to launch the initiative this semester! I have run the initiative by Health Promotion Unit, the response person to student disclosures and various committees I sit on. This semester will be more like a trial run and then get feedback from SCE Officers at the end of the year.

Abortion Rights Campaign

I have been really pleased with this campaign and the passion I've seen. We are putting all of our focus into the big demonstration this Friday at 4pm and the Petition which will be presented to parliament on Friday. Thanks to all the work from Nicole on this.

Period product access

Aidan and I were looking at the possibility of expanding the Share the Dignity project at UWA, but this wasn't possible. I then focussed instead on expanding the Pink Box initiative which although sometimes a flawed system, does provide students with access to period products.
