6.1 Managing Director

-Guild has been working on master plan.

- -Had meeting with the University going to be a big overhaul around Guild motions process. University has made it clear that behaviour of council is unacceptable in terms of how motions. Not about shutting down freedom of speech but comes down the impact of behaviour in the workplace relations and how behaviour of yourself to others is addressed (violence, defamation etc). University is happy to take any student complaints from Council to the integrity complaints team, and they will action this as they see fit. Guild is going to look at the Standing Orders which will be reviewed again after 2021 Revie which was done by Brie, myself and Jackson McDonald and governance committee.
- Attacks against staff members is not going to be tolerated this will go to the University and FairWork commission if required. Justin Gauder (Head of UWA Safety) will be brought in to deal with harm in the workplace with additional training to Council. Student are bound by university student conduct and rules and regulations.



- CB not about the Council and how this impacts ISU.
- TG You're in a workplace environment and the way you treat your fellow student is the same as in a workplace. Workplace harm is suppose to be dealt with by the board (Guild Council), and you could be liable. If you harm a staff member or a fellow student, you could be liable.
- GJ Even though we are in the Guild Council Room, we operate under the UWA bylaws and have to follow these by-laws, thereby making us liable to these practices.
- TU Mentioned harassment, thinking election time is that counted as harassment.

TG – No, it's about physical harassment or threatening behaviour not about messaging students for voting but about badgering, forced cohesion or threating in person, online text etc is not acceptable. 6.2 Finance Director (presented by TG)

Accounts are looking good – profit of \$83,000 for the year. Loss of \$294,000. However, still few months to go but looking like breaking even or a small loss. Catering is doing well and travelling in the right direction. Student Innovation Centre has had grants allocated. PSA Event turned into a profit, there's also a timing difference. VM – Overall a profit of \$11,000. TG – Profit is to do with rebates that's why there's a negative position on that. Some outlets will go into negative due to slow season but that's expected and are travelling well. Quobba is not operating so will impact the profits next year. Pitching a decrease in Guild revenue and will be monitored over the next few months and be tracked.

VM – Additional seating outside Hackett Café, is that a Guild Decision? TG – Yes, they asked the University to add seating. Expanded seating will be great and boost student experience and use of facilities on campus.

6.3 Commercial (presented by TG)

Catering review is on the second phase. Want to centralise the kitchens to help with efficiency. Hackett doesn't make money, so maybe change the product offering in Hackett to boost profits and potentially change it to a study space that serves coffee instead of a lunch hub.

6.4 Student Services (presented by TG)

Looking at merging Guild Bookshop and GSC to save space during the Guild renovations and master plan.

- 1.1. Recommends a review and standardisation of processes for the department elections that do not occur with the main Guild Elections to the Governance Committee
- 1.2. Makes the following recommendations for the Election Culture Committee and Governance Committee to investigate and put in place if deemed appropriate;

1.2.1. Engaging the WAEC or an external body to conduct the voting process at departmental AGMs;

1.2.2.Moving the departmental elections to all open nominations at the same time and for individual polling to take place during an allocated week without overlapping timeslots;

1.2.3.The creation of an appeals standing committee made up of Guild members who do not and have not served on Guild Council to deal with matters arising from the department elections;

1.2.4. Moving the Department elections forward to allow for appeals to be heard in a timely manner;

1.2.5. Department AGM & Elections Schedules to be fixed and approved at the same meeting of Guild Council where the Guild Election timetables are approved, including but not limited to;

- 1.2.5.1. Venue of the Vote;
- 1.2.5.2. Time period that ballots are open;
- 1.2.5.3. Duration for the Registration to vote;
- 1.2.5.4. Method of registration to vote ;
- 1.2.5.5. Method and deadline for Nomination; and
- 1.2.5.6. Polling period (if needed).
- FOR: VM Recommedations to try move to more fair, stronger way to run election.
- FOR: GJ Believes these recommendations are the right thing to do.
- FOR: IC Need to clean up our own house. Autonomous regulations are not up to scratch and grateful for the recommendation for the 111th Guild Council.
- FOR: AG Epecially with the appeal today, this is important. With whom can register and vote. Ask TG to speak on who can vote. TG Access is



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there for a particular group of people and those who registered with UniAccess should be allowed to vote. AG – Will this apply to the incoming Guild and the March election? TG – No it won't. University can take students off from voting if not deemed relevant to the election – will be discussed by next year's governance group. CB – responding to what TG said – concerns about needing a UAP to register, carers don't have UAP and those who aren't wealthy enough can't get proper medical diagnosis will be excluded from voting as well. TG – Look its possible but from what I viewed the other day, I don't believe that for a second, more concerned with people who are voting that were not representative of the needs of the department. CB raises concern about standardising election process. AS raises question about committee of people not elected to Guild Council, however, should include people who haven't also run for a party. Recommendation for the 111th Council.
