14. MOTION WITHOUT NOTICE (REPRESENTATION)

14. 1 The 112th Guild Council:

14.1.1 Condemns the Iranian and Taliban regimes' practice of Gender Apartheid, which is an institutionalised system of authoritarian governance that dehumanises, persecutes and systemically segregates women and excludes them from public life

14.1.2 Acknowledges that the Taliban's Gender Apartheid practices constitute the most serious women's rights crisis in the world, as declared by Human Rights Watch and United Nations Women, with draconian rules imposed on women including bans on education past the 6th grade, moving freely in public without a male guardian, and female voices from being broadcast in public, amongst others.

14.1.3 Recognises that Gender Apartheid is a crime against humanity.

14.1.4 Supports the global initiatives that are working on achieving United Nations recognition of Gender Apartheid as a crime against humanity.

14.1.5 Encourages the 113th Guild Council to help raise awareness about gender apartheid through events, petitions and digital campaigns in consultation with relevant stakeholders.

14. 2 The 112th Guild Council:

- 14.2.1** Recognises that the Rapid Support Forces (RSF) in Sudan have committed a series of brutal attacks and war crimes in el-Fasher, as recognised by Amnesty International.
- 14.2.2** Recognises that Sudan is facing a humanitarian crisis affecting 30 million people, as well as mass displacement and confirmed famine
- 14.2.3** Acknowledges the role of countries such as the United Arab Emirates (UAE) in funding the war and brutality, as recognised by Amnesty International
- 14.2.4** Calls on the Australian government to review defence exports to the UAE and demand an international arms embargo on the whole of Sudan
- 14.2.5** Directs the UWA Student Guild alongside the Ethnocultural Department to create an informational post for students standing in solidarity with the people of Sudan, including any Sudanese students at UWA, and affirming the Guild's stance of anti-racism
- 14.2.6** Boycotts companies complicit in the UAE's human rights violations such as, but not limited to, Emirates Airways, Etihad Airways, and ongoing boycott targets.
