- Heard updates from Lisa Goldacre during the CaLD WG meeting that they are researching the University of Toronto multifaith spaces and the Monash Campus Cohesion Research project
- Their main concerns are to do with student safety and mindful inclusion of all faiths
- Looking into having temporary multifaith spaces, particularly for minority faith clubs to hold regular events before permanent rooms are established.

This year, we held various social media campaigns to raise awareness and foster conversation around important issues affecting CaLD students. In Semester 1, we posted a Ramadan Guide to support students in applying for Special Considerations and outlining the various support services available to them. In Semester 2, we worked closely with the Australian Human Rights Commission to promote the national Racism@Uni survey, also worked to host a forum discussing how students can stand together against racism.

Throughout the year, we continued our efforts to establish multifaith prayer rooms, a space for students of all faiths, particularly those of minority faiths. We extended consultations with various clubs, including the Sikh Society, Bahai Club and Hindu Yuva. These efforts must continue into 2026.

Recommendations

The 2026 Ethnocultural Department must continue to work closely with cultural clubs to ensure that they are supported in their events and to amplify their voices to the Guild Council. The Department must extend collaborations with other Guild Departments, particularly the Womens, Access, Pride and International Students Department. The Department must continue to promote the CaLD Blogs and 'You Can't Ask That' video series to engage with students from a range of cultural backgrounds.

Regarding the Theme Week, there must continue to be a strong focus on advocating against racial discrimination and highlighting the support services that are available to CaLD students. As Harmony Day on March 21st coincides with the International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination, the Department must ensure a balance between celebrating cultural diversity and promoting anti-racism initiatives. Due to the immense outreach of the Theme Weeks, it may be worth hosting a second Theme Week in the second semester with a focus on linguistic diversity. This may coincide with the WA Language Week (4th to 10th August) and is an excellent opportunity to collaborate with language clubs.

ENGAGEMENT WITH THE UNIVERSITY

Academic Board

Received a report from the Vice-Chancellor on the International Student Caps and the continuing impacts it's having on UWA. Amit also highlighted how UWA is working to build better relationships with high schools and colleges to future-proof the university from the impacts of the caps and other issues. Amit also discussed the potential university merger. We then approved the ATAR review as discussed in UEC and the new pathways for high school students to come to UWA.

Then received biennial school reports from the School of Human Sciences, Dental School, Law School, Medical School, and School of Agriculture and Environment. Then approved numerous items and communications en bloc.

Joint Meeting of the University Education Committee and University Admissions Committee

This agenda item was identical to the one brought to the Curriculum Framework Working Party last month. This was a lengthy meeting that only consisted of one agenda item which was a paper presenting a comprehensive review of the role of the Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) in undergraduate admissions at UWA.

The main conclusion of this paper was to lower UWA's ATAR admission to 70. This had lengthy discussions around worries of reputational damage, student success and different avenues students have to pursue to get into the degree they want. This will be progress to Academic Board for final approval.

University Education Committee

Shorter meeting than usual today due to the Joint Meeting beforehand with the University Admissions Committee. Received a presentation and approved a framework around trans-disciplinary delivery of programming and machine learning content in coursework units which will go to Academic Board for approval. Additionally did the same for the new University Policy on Third Party Education Partnerships.

Next phase of meeting involved a presentation on UWA's new pathways program which will begin rolling out in schools in 2026 ideally pending Academic Board approval. Finally, Fiona from Student Life presented on the Student Experience Benchmark Survey, highlighting digital experience as a particular area of improvement for UWA in the coming year or so.

Academic Quality and Standards Committee

Final AQSC meeting for the year. Was a very brief meeting with the agenda consisting of multiple reviews. Mainly annual course reviews, comprehensive course reviews, academic quality review, desktop review and comprehensive degree reviews. There were some other non-significant items en bloc but mostly an uneventful, brief final meeting of AQSC.

Student Achievement Working Party Meeting

Submitting this report before attending SAWP but the agenda is mainly a recap and discussion on student experience at UWA this year. Includes a recap of all the working done by the following SAWP streams:

- *Inclusion, Belonging and Wellbeing*
- *First Year Experience*
- *Student Experience 2030*
- *Employability and Career Development*
- *Journal Club*

Curriculum Framework Working Group

Attended my final Curriculum Framework Working Group of my term! The only thing on the agenda was the reforming of the comprehensive degrees at UWA, including ensuring students are taking more targeted units as a part of their degree.

This proposal included mandatory foundational units for each Bachelor, I raised that this might not be totally appropriate, especially with the Bachelor of Arts where the majors available vary significantly and thus foundational units might not work that well. This perspective was accepted by the committee and they are re-working this part before it progresses further.

Safer Communities Advisory Group

Attended my first Safer Communities Advisory Group meeting. Was a very brief meeting as not much was on the agenda but mostly involved Student Life and Nikhi giving a recap of the work of the committee and the collaborations run this year to make campus safer. Was then a discussion about the work of the committee next year especially with the National Student Safety Survey coming down the line.

DISCUSSION POINTS

I wanted to be Ed Council President long before I ever was. I can truly say it has been a complete honour and privilege. Serving alongside all of you and working every day to better the student experience has been so rewarding and fulfilling. 

Digital Badging with UWA Advance

- A proper Word Document has been made providing the details of each activity and any information requested by UWA Advance. Furthermore, all proposed badges were accepted by the UWA Advance coordinators and are going through additional channels for formal approval.
- This project will be handed over to the incoming SOC President, Jono so that he is able to complete the project if needed.
- Additionally, I have asked the UWA Advance coordinator, Tristan, to also investigate getting activities like the proposed badges added into students' transcripts. More information will need to be done by whoever works on this project next.
