PROJECT UPDATE

Student Experience Committee Working Group

- [from April] Still waiting on UWA working group leads to define the scope of the investigation there was one meeting I missed due to mandatory classes, but this was relayed as the general outcome of that meeting.
- No updates since previous still waiting on UWA staff to narrow down the scope.

Student Reference Group

- Taking on a role within the student reference working group at the request of Emma and Fiona, looking to act as a student communication conduit to the larger committee this working group is a subset of.
- Worked with Tenille to set a new agenda looking at cost of living and how both UWA and the Guild can best support students through this.

Exam Results Back

- Brought this to the Student Experience committee, and some positive feedback seemed to be received. Overall, some considerations are that this remains after the moderation process for marks, and after exam results are finalised, in order to avoid logistical concerns raised. Need to review UWA policy at some point as well to compare it to existing possibilities.

Food for cultural holidays

- Product of C+T meeting need to consult Ethnocultural and PAC on what holidays would be good. Trying to provide at Guild outlets food specific to certain cultural holidays so as to allow students to have access to these foods when they might be away from home or culture.
- Meetings so far have been delayed given other commitments rearing up.

Food for fines

- Worked with Jude and Nikhi, waiting to hear back from Nikhi after she has now brought it to a committee. This project aims to help with cost of living and to encourage donations of essential food items instead of parking fines.

Pub Crawl Club Package

Working with Ethan, Emilia, and Catering to bring out a package to enable clubs to use tav for pub crawls instead of Varsity or other places. Meeting on 8/5/25 was positive – some key potential snags were identified around drink pricing, competition with Varsity, and the intention to offer this as an easy alternative on nights where Varsity is less of an option.

Marketing

- Worked with the marketing team to shoot some fun content for the cafés this month, as well as doing a fun segment with Perth is OK to help promote campus culture and student life! Had a lot of fun with this.

ENGAGEMENT WITH THE UNIVERSITY

University Education Committee

Attended my first Education Committee for the year after having the miss the Feburary one. Was very insightful. The committee had a ranging discussion about a proposal to reduce and merge the number of Education Committees from 18 to 10, due to no consensus on the topic the decision was postponed until the August Education Committee Meeting. Also referred UWA Modes of Delivery to Academic Board for final consideration and approval. Student Life additionally gave an update on student wellbeing, highlight what we already know – the cost of living crisis is hitting students extraorindary hard, and they gave a special shoutout to the Guild for our efforts in trying to address it for students.

Furthermore, we reviewed and revised the University Policy on Lecture Capture, the University Policy on Review and Appeal of Academic Decisions, and the UWA Timetabiling Policy. All these issues will now proceed to Academic Board for final approval.

Review of Assessment Working Group

Attended my first Review of Assessment Working Group. Was great to participate in this group. We had hoped to submit our policy memo for consideration at this meeting but due to a busy agenda Kabilan asked us to submit it at the June meeting instead so ideally we'll have a positive update on their reception to our policies after next month's meeting. Had a wide-ranging discussion of exam rules and timetable deviation

which the staff received student feedback really well. We then moved on to a discussion on group assessments were I advocated for SPARKPlus to become mandatory in all group assessments, and some form of group contract, to end the continued issues of equal marking for group members who don't carry their weight. This advocacy was well-received by the committee and will hopefuly be actioned.

Then further received updates from the working streams about their activities and alongside one of the staff, pushed for examination marks and final assessment marks to be given to students alongside their final unit grades.

Academic Quality and Standards Committee

Attended the Academic Quality and Standards meeting where we received an update from Daniela Ulgiati, the Chair, on UWA's TEQSA rating which was positive. We then moved through the agenda points including a discussion on the Annual Course Review and Desktop Course Review. Furthermore, there was an update and discussion on the Comprehensive Undergraduate Degree Course Review.

There was also a discussion on the Postgraduate Mandatory Course Monitoring Process which was interesting. All these items were noted for discussion and will progress to Academic Board for final review and decision.

University Learning and Teaching Committee

Attended my 3rd Learning and Teaching Committee for the year. Perhaps the most interesting agenda point was the introduction of a new admissions system at UWA. This system is set to make admissions more easy and streamlined. This system has been implemented in over 20 Australia Universities, including the University of Adelaide. There were a couple of flags raised by academics but was addressed and taken by staff.

Then received an update from A/Pro Vice-Chancellor Andrew Williams (Learning and Teaching) and an update from the University Learning and Teaching Standing Committees.

Academic Integrity Advisory Group

Received an update from the Chair about the current contact cheating review and the difficulties in administering or addressing contact cheating. Agreed to reassess and take decision back to Academic Board if the workload is unable to be managed. Then discussed the current Academic Integrity Policy Review and calls for an open consultation process. Further, there was a discussion on the use of deepseek by students.

There was also a discussion on the potential ability to have a support person for SAIO meetings for students which is a positive step. Finally we discussed a proposal to endorse the exam office to review examination and invigilation procedures to combat against AI-based cheating.

Academic Board

Attended the second Academic Board (AB) for the year. The Board received a report from the Vice-Chancellor about the activities and progress of the University over the past three months. From there the Board approved a name change to the School of Allied Health to bolster its accreditation status for the new nursing degree at UWA. AB also approved the creation of new engineering scholarships with advocacy for more scholarships for students outside of STEM degrees.

Reports were then given from the external school review and the biennial school reports from population and global health. Multiple items were then approved en bloc by the committee.

Julia Suffell Environment Officer Guild Council Report - June 2nd July, 2025

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June has been a quiet month of reflection and planning for the next semester, as students are busy with exams and holidays. I have spent the break teaching primary school students tree planting with Friends of Lake Claremont and snorkelling the Ningaloo Reef.

It is devastating to see the impacts of climate change first hand. Ningaloo has experienced an unprecedented marine heat wave, bleaching 95+% of the reef in large areas. The difference from my last visit to Exmouth in 2022 to now is insane. It makes me angry knowing the Labor government has approved Woodside's North West Shelf extension, which will further stress the World Heritage listed coastline, when our marine life and coral reefs are already under severe threat. It is essential we continue to speak up about our future and advocate for a rapid transition to renewable energy.

The Environment Department was able to spread this message at our 'Rising Up' film screening. This event was a huge success with over 160 students attending, educating about the climate crisis and empowering young people to take action. We look forward to continuing to spread this message into next semester, as well as working on many other initiatives such as reducing litter pollution at UWA.

PROJECT UPDATE

Rising Up – Film Screening, Workshop and Q&A Panel

The Blue Minds workshop was a massive success, with over 160 students rocking up. The event featured a film screening of 'Rising Up' – a documentary around environmental issues such as climate change, sea level rise and plastic pollution, and how young people can drive change and create an impact. The event was the first time all the natural sciences clubs at UWA collaborated – Science Union, SNAGS, SEEC, Zoology Club, Marine Biology Club and Oceans Institute Student Society. We received over \$2000 in giveaway prizes, featuring many local sustainable small businesses.

We were fortunate to hear from Sophie McNeill MLA about Woodside's North West Shelf gas project extension, which was approved by the Labor government the day before. It was a fantastic opportunity for students to learn about the Browse Project and that they can still save Scott Reef from over 50 gas wells being built around it.

Speakers:

- Kal Glanznig Creator of 'Rising Up' documentary, Co-Founder of Blue Minds Youth Ocean Leadership, Plastic Free Cronulla and the Youth Ocean Carnival. Elected as independent concillor for Sutherland Shire.
- Cooper Chapman Founder of Good Human Factory, Co-Founder of Blue Minds Youth Ocean Leadership, ex-professional surfer in the World Surf League for a decade
- Ben Fitzpatrick Featured in Corals Last Stand documentary about the North West Shelf and saving Scott Reef, leader of Ecosystem Management at International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN), Director of Oceanwise, PhD in Marine Science at UWA
- Jemima Williamson-Wong climate and community advocate. Elected to the City of Fremantle Council in 2023, served as WA State Coordinator of the Australian Youth Climate Coalition, and was a 2021 Climate Conversation Fellow.
- Marco Ghisalberti associate professor at UWA Oceans Institute, PhD in fluid and coastal dynamics from MIT. Inspired students through science and creativity, including the popular Fluid Mechanics Photography & Video Competition.

It was exciting to see many representatives from environmental charities attend the event, including Conservation Council of WA, Australian Youth Climate Coalition (AYCC) WA, Ocean Impact Organisation, Blue Crew, Disrupt Burrup Hub and Cold Nips.

Upcoming Events – Semester 2:

June has involved a lot of planning for next semester. We have many exciting events coming up.

Week 1 – End Forest Mining Panel and Trillion Trees Planting

Conservation Council of WA, The Wilderness Society, Jarrahdale Forest Protectors, Dwellingup Discovery Forest, Peel Environmental Protection Alliance and the Environment Department of UWA Student Guild will be collaborating for an informative evening hearing about Alcoa's plans to bulldoze over 11,500 hectares of WA's precious Northern Jarrah forests. Students will have the opportunity to listen to speakers on the topic of deforestation & habitat loss, air and water contamination, life by the refinery, First Nations perspectives, nature based recreation tourism, and the WA environmental approvals process and learn how to have a say. Students will be guided to submit a comment during the Alcoa Public Environmental Review period, which closes August 21st, 2025.

We will also be collaborating with Guild Volunteering during week 1 to run a tree planting day with Trillion Trees. This will also feature a workshop on the importance of conserving our forests and nature.

Week 2 – Pop-Up Op Shop at O'Day 2

The Environmet Department in collaboration with Guild Volunteering will host another Pop-Up Op Shop at O'Day 2. This time, Bindaring will be providing the clothes, with 100% of the sales going to the Red Cross.

Week 3 - Containers for Change Workshop

We are very fortunate to have the incredible Ross Belton speak at UWA about his experience as the former Policy Advisor for the Environment Minister of WA. Ross significantly advocated for and implemented the Containers for Change program from the early 2000s to it's launch in 2020.

Week 4 – Interfac Campus Clean Up

Enviro is running an Interfac Campus Clean Up. This event will feature prizes for the facsoc with the most rubbish collected and highest attendance, and a free sausage sizzle after to reward participants. I am hoping to get a speaker from Keep WA Beautiful Council for this event to speak about plastic pollution and the importance of reducing your waste. The event will be followed by a clean up audit, which can be sent to UWA and City of Perth to hopefully depict how much rubbish is present, and the urgency to ensure UWA's waste management is up to scratch.

I have been working with the Sports Officer, Damien to advertise this event to the faculty societies. We are advocating for the event to contribute to points for Interfac Sport and advertise it at Interfac meetings.

Advocacy:

North West Shelf Gas Extension:

Since passing a motion at May's Guild Council, the Environment Department has been working hard to ensure students are educated about the devastating consequences of Woodside's North West Shelf extension. Enviro wrote a 'Submission Guide' to help students navigate submitting public comment about drilling at Scott Reef and created social media content about the extension. Next semester, we're hoping to run a film screening of 'Corals Last Stand' documentary about Woodside's proposal to drill at Scott Reef. I have also worked with Rama, who has addressed this issue at the National Union of Student's (NUS) Education Conference.

Keep Cup Sale:

After speaking to the Catering and Tav committee earlier this year about ways we can reduce single-use items at Guild cafés, they implemented a 40% off sale during exams. The Environment Department helped to promote this sale. 76 keep cups were sold, which is a fantastic success. We will continue this sale into the start of semester 2, as part of 'Sustainable Action August'.

Keep Cup Library:

The Environment Department is excited to launch UWA's Keep Cup Library. UWA Guild and UWA have ordered Stanley keep cups which students can borrow, take to class and return whenever they'd like, to any Guild café. This will launch for Sustainable Action August — at the start of semester 2. Student volunteers and the Environment Department will hand out free cookies to anyone who decides to borrow a keep cup during the start of semester.

UWA's New Waste Management System:

Working with UWA to implement their new bin system, which will ensure all signage around UWA is consistent and easy to read for students. However, not much progress has been made yet as I'm waiting for a reply with the information. Once we receive the information, we hope to use social media to educate students around the new system.

Containers for Change bins at UWA:

We had some success, as UWA's Sustainability Officers contacted Containers for Change to implement some drop off points at UWA. However, Containers for Change has said they have a waitlist until the end of July. We hope to get this up and running during semester 2.
