Student Experience Committee Working Group

- [from April] Still waiting on UWA working group leads to define the scope of the investigation there was one meeting I missed due to mandatory classes, but this was relayed as the general outcome of that meeting.
- No updates since previous still waiting on UWA staff to narrow down the scope.

Student Reference Group

- Taking on a role within the student reference working group at the request of Emma and Fiona, looking to act as a student communication conduit to the larger committee this working group is a subset of.
- Worked with Tenille to set a new agenda looking at cost of living and how both UWA and the Guild can best support students through this.

Exam Results Back

 Brought this to the Student Experience committee, and some positive feedback seemed to be received. Overall, some considerations are that this remains after the moderation process for marks, and after exam results are finalised, in order to avoid logistical concerns raised. Need to review UWA policy at some point as well to compare it to existing possibilities.

Food for cultural holidays

- Product of C+T meeting need to consult Ethnocultural and PAC on what holidays would be good. Trying to provide at Guild outlets food specific to certain cultural holidays so as to allow students to have access to these foods when they might be away from home or culture.
- Meetings so far have been delayed given other commitments rearing up.

Food for fines

- Worked with Jude and Nikhi, and this one is going ahead!! Very glad to see UWA taking feedback and ideas on board. This project aims to help with cost of living and to encourage donations of essential food items instead of parking fines.

Pub Crawl Club Package

- Working with Ethan, Emilia, and Catering to bring out a package to enable clubs to use tav for pub crawls instead of Varsity or other places. Again, delayed due to other commitments.

University Learning and Teaching Committee

Was a lighter agenda for learning and teaching committee this month. Most of the meeting centred around a discussion on the transition from blackboard original to blackboard ultra. This change will hopefully usher in more uniformity for students LMS across units as well as more advanced teaching technologies. There was also a discussion about the School Learning and Teaching Awards and from the ULTC Standing Committees.

PROSH date was an item en bloc but was moved for discussion as some academics had concerns about PROSH being scheduled on Wednesday of Week 4. Had a wide ranging discussion and I advocated strongly for PROSH and it being an important part of student culture. This wasn't a decision for the committee though so PROSH will be staying as is!

Academic Quality and Standards Committee

Attended the Academic Quality and Standards meeting where we received an update from Daniela Ulgiati, the Chair, undergraduate mandatory continuous course monitoring processes. Daniela also provided an update on the actions they are taking around reviewing undergraduate comprehensive couses and postgraduate comprehensive courses. These items will be escalated to UEC.

There was also en bloc decisions around professional accreditation status and risk and communications around regulatory expectations and Academic Board deliberations.

Curriculum Framework Working Party

Brief agenda this month. Zac Aman from the Engineering School who has prepared a extensive data overview of student retention rates in certain degree types. There was also a discussion on the impact of ATAR and weightings in UWA's competitive advantage against other WA Universities.

The two main agenda items were a discussion around comprehensive degrees and minors at UWA. There was more discussion about expanding minors to 8 units instead of 4 and how to attract students to study comprehensive degrees at UWA. Very interesting!

Student Consultative Committee

Glad to see this committee make a comeback mid-way through the year. There was no agenda for this meeting and more just a good base for all the FacSocs, the Guild President, PSA President and I to meet with Student Life and other representatives to discuss issues facing students and how Student Life can better support the student body.

Was a really solid roundtable and had good turnout so I'm looking forward to seeing the work of this committee for the rest of the term.

Young Leaders Conference:

We are currently working with UWA Future Students to create a plan for next year's conferences. I hope with some adjustments, such as making the conferences early in Semester 1, will attract more students in the future and make the conference continue. It is such a fantastic opportunity for high school students to learn more about the incredible opportunities at UWA and connect with student leaders.

Events:

Alcoa's Plan for Western Australian Jarrah Forests:

Enviro held a talk on Alcoa's bauxite mining extension proposal in collaboration with Conservation Council of WA, WA Forest Alliance and The Wilderness Society. It was a very informative evening, which went into detail of the ecological, economic and cultural impacts of the extension, with over 200 people attending.

The Environment Department is going to be screening the 'Corals Last Stand' documentary about Scott Reef and the impacts of Woodside's North West Shelf Project extension. We are hoping to have a panel of speakers around the impacts of climate change and oil extraction around coral reefs.

ISD Lighthouse Magazine:

Enviro will be submitting a couple articles for the International Student Department's Lighthouse Magazine. This is a fantastic opportunity to educate students about recycling and initiatives on campus. We look forward to seeing the end result!

Containers for Change:

Still waiting to hear back from Containers for Change about implementing a drop off point at Uni Hall. They said they'd contact us at end of July, so just waiting.

UWA's 2030 Sustainability Strategy:

It seems the strategy has been put on halt as a staff member has taken leave.

However, I met with the Sustainability committee to discuss it, advocating for UWA to invest in renewable energy and divest from fossil fuel companies. UWA is also making progress on reducing plastic and litter pollution via a new waste management system and educating students about sustainable practices.

- This Month the accessible period care project was complete with the installation of five period care dispensers in each of the UWA Libraries: Reid Library, Barry J Marshall Library, Beasley Law Library, EDFAA Library and J. Robin Warren Library.
- I met with Melanie Barret to check how the dispensers were tracking after the two-week mark and also to label the different product slots
- We held an event with the UWA Craft Club, making vision boards

Having attended the National Union of Students (NUS) National Conference in December 2023, I must say I thought I was prepared for NUS Education Conference 2025. It was to my surprise that I was! Whilst certaintly not perfect and full of NUS hallmarks of factional fighting, tears, and stringent debate, the Education Conference was well-run (for NUS standards) and I got some real value out of some of the workshops. Unlike the National Conference, it felt like student leaders were there to learn something and not just score factional points all the time.

I hope this is a sign that the NUS will move to be a more productive, functioning union in the future. I won't hold my breath but one can dream I suppose.

DAY ONE

Plenary - Education Office: Introduction to EdCon

Started off the conference full of hope to learn about EdCon. Of course many Unity members were waiting to hear what EdCon was (how they got to that point without knowing is beyond me). Quickly divulged into a debate about the bombings in Iran and the need for the NUS to hold a press conference. Salt supported, Unity didn't, NLS couldn't decide. Whilst not a hopeful way to start the conference, it certaintly was interesting!

Shelf Life Expired

This workshop was presented by UWA's own Rama Sugiartha, alongside a student from Monash University and a student for Curtin University. I found this workshop to be well-researched, well-presented and offered some good debate. It centred on the impact of the recent Woodside North West Shelf Expansion, including its impacts to indigenous rock art, the environment and CO2 emissions. The Monash President detailed how the Monash Union are trying to break ties with Woodside.

A Unity speaker noted that the Labor Government couldn't consider climate change in the extension, a point a Salt member quicily rebuked.

Fighting Education Cuts

Lots of universities are facing course cuts at the moment as these institutions restructure and repriortise. Unis are effectively functioning as a business, not a higher education institution. This pattern was the focus of this workshop. Good discussion about the ways Guild's can push back on course cuts more generally and patterns for us to track in the future.

Divided we fall, United we conquer: The Necessity of a Broad Left Student Movement

This was presented by three students for USyd. Was an interesting presentation about the need to unite as a left student movement and the different tactics they use to engage the general student population who tend to care less about politics as a whole. Interesting but probably rather useless.

Plenary – Welfare Office: Improving NUS Campaigns

This plenary focused on the NUS Welfare Survey and included a panel discussion about how NUS campaigns could be improved. There was a lot of interesting insight from most the speakers on the panel and a lot of good points about the need for the NUS to focus on a few specific campaigns throughout the year instead of juggling dozens of ineffective campaigns. The NUS President nodded and agreed, whether this will come to fruition remains to be seen, although somehow I doubt it.

DAY TWO

Plenary – What's Wrong with our Universities, and What Can We Do About It?

This plenary was presented by former UWA Secretary Rob Lyall. He discussed his time as a member of NUS predecessor, NUAUS. He also discussed his experiences as a professor. I found this plenary fascinating and his perspectives of the problems in universities very interesting. The focus on profit over students being a major point he raised as to why universities aren't serving the student population. He made the point that the price of a degree is so high and the quality of service so low which I thought was interesting.

The People's Inquiry into Campus Free Speech on Palestine

This workshop was presented by the NUS Education Officer and centred on the attacks on freedom of speech at university campuses across Australia, particulary over the issue of Palestine. Was interesting to hear the perspectices of the presenters and people in the room, especially as UWA have faced some of the harshes restrictions on student voice.

Plenary – Why the West has Greenlit a Genocide

This was presented by two members of Socialist Alternative and focused on the genocide in Gaza, the role Western governments have played in facilitating it, and why public opinion has shifted recently. There wasn't anything new about this plenary but I found it insightful regardless.

Crisis Management: Successful Student Union Campaigns

This panel was again very interesting, focusing on cuts to guilds and courses and policy changes. It then delved into successful student union campaigns and how we can fight back against some repressive policies. Regardless, nothing really new learnt here.

Kindness Across the Aisle: Fighting for Shared Goals and Interests On-Campus and at the NUS

This was perhaps the most useful panel of the entire conference. It facilitated an opportunity for people to work in groups to brainstorm issues students face on campus and how we as student leaders can respond to them. Was really great to hear the perspectives of other universities, the things they've done on their campuses, and work together to solve big issues.

The Importance of Union Education

This was a nice presentation on union history and the importance of unionism and educating students about unions. Not much beyond that.

Our Revolution?: An Analysis of Socialist Alternative

A very spicy session to end Day Two. There were some interesting emails presented and accusations made about members of Socialist Alternative. Lots of fighting from Socialist Alternative and Student Unity – but almost no substance.

DAY THREE

Plenary - Women's Office: Diversity in Education

This plenary focused on the segration of university courses, focusing on the high female enrolments in nursing and social work and the low female enrolments in STEM subjects in particular. A good panel discussion then took place.

Smashing the Manosphere

This was an interesting presentation about the online radicalisation of young men in particular in online spaces or the so called 'Manosphere.' Certaintly relevant to the times. There was a debate about what strategy to employ but otherwise a more united workshop from the factions.

Plenary - The Housing Crisis in Australia

This was a plenary from Jordan van den Lamb about the housing crisis in Australia and the problem with landlords and government policy. Relevant topic. Very contreverisal debate. Regardless though I didn't find this presentation to be that helpful about how we can support students with housing or make colleges more affordable.

Faith, Culture, and Belonging: Safe Spaces for All

Presented by students across Australia, including UWA's own Suchi Kalia. Was a very nice presentation on religious diversity and these student's experiences with racism on campuses. A very emotional panel and left you with a lot to consider about how Guild's support ALL people.

Why the NDIS Fails Disabled People

This panel focused on opposing the NDIS system, pushing for the NUS to oppose it and endorse a genuine disability healthcare scheme. I didn't find this panel particualry helpful from a Guild perspective but found the debate personally interesting.

Societies Pricing Out Society: The Dying Culture of Student Engagement

This workshop was a deep dive into how rising costs and the cost of living crisis have impacted student engagement. Most students have to work full- or part-time now to survive and are unable to afford club events and engaging with student life. The panel discussed why this has happened and also what we as Guild's can do to address it. UWA is miles ahead on this front with free period products, food pantry, free pregnancy tests and more.

The NUS Should Stand with the CFMEU

Was a workshop about why the NUS should stand with the CFMEU. Lots of drama and debate, not much value add for students.

DAY FOUR

Plenary – The Practice of Leadership and Organising

This presentation was given by Dunn Street founder and Labor/Democrat advisor Stephen Donnelly outlined principles of community organising, empowering people to move to purposeful collective action. Pushed the six key leadership practices that underpin successful organising. Was disappointed for some members to jeer and mock the presenter but otherwise I found it to be interesting.

The Right to Protest is Being Attacked

This workshop focused on the response to the Palestine movement by governments and universities in Australia. Pushing hard to curtail protest rights across the country. Very relevant here at UWA but nothing substantively different from other workshops and plenaries of a similar topic.

Cut Ties with Trump's America

This was presented by Socialist Alternative about the need to cut ties with Trump's America and why that should be an NUS position. Interesting debate, interesting points – not much beyond that.

Graphic Design in Political Communication

This workshop centred on graphic design in student politics. I very much enjoyed this workshop and got some helpful tips and advice.

Can the Centre Defeat the Right

This centred on how the right can be defeated in politics. Once again, interesting debate, interesting points but largely repeated what had been discussed throughout the conference.

Labor's Climate Crimes

Outlined the state of the climate crisis and the record of the Albanese Labor Government three years into its term. I thought a lot of salient points were made and there was contentious debate from all sides. Again this was one of those workshops that was 'fun' to attend but maybe didn't have a lot of value add for what we as a Guild can do.

Plenary – Queer Office: The NUS' Role in Defending Trans Rights

This was a panel discussion on what the NUS is doing to defend trans rights and what more can be done. It started off well but unfourtantely Socialist Alternative heckled a trans member on the panel, leading Forge, NLS, and other Independents to leave and continue the panel elsewhere. Socialist Alternative and Unity stayed...

KEY TAKEAWAYS FOR THE GUILD

- We are so lucky to have 50% SSAF.
- I actually found this conference to be productive, useful and interesting at times with less focus on yelling and arguing all the time. Whilst it certaintly wasn't perfect, it gave me hope that UWA's ongoing affiliation to the NUS should continue.
- UWA is leaps and bounda ahead of most other student unions in terms of our services and advocacy
 and how our Guild functions. This is thanks in part to our long history and in part to our large SSAF. I
 think we should consider preparing a workshop on the way we run our Guild and what other unions
 could learn from us for the next Education Conference.
- Other insights include:
 - o Focused, impactful campaigns work better than dozens of unfocused, unresourced campaigns.
 - o Cross-group and union collaboration is powerful and necessary.
 - War, climate and corporate ties are major issues plaguing much of what distresses student populations at a national level.
 - o Higher education is continuing to be commercialised.
 - You can't restore campus culture and student engagement without addressing the cost of living crisis.
