Guild Master Plan update

- Reviewing TRCB documents to look at feasibility of restructuring how the Guild flows from the GSC to the offices, to look at a new lift near the GSC. Not much progress, TRCB still drafting.

O-Week

- O'Day afters – went very well! Huge success with over 500 tickets sold (sold out!) and a great evening had by all.
- Lots more fun Guild activities each day during O-Week, thank you to Leigh and Alice for all your work on these ones!!

Platinum Tickets

- Launched during O'Week! At least 900 distributed last I checked, sure it's much higher now.

Tav Wednesdays

- biggest numbers we've seen on Tav Wednesday recently! Had to turn people away from the door when we were at capacity at some points throughout the night. Continuing weeks 0-3 inclusive.

NUS Engagement

- Been in contact with the new NUS President Felix Hughes, who will be visiting UWA in February
- Also been in contact with our new State Branch President, Rama Sugiarta (congrats!)
- Went to the Presidents' Summit, learnt lots. See individual report.

Food for Fines

- Running this year in the months of March and August!
- Preparing marketing campaign

Budget Bites

- Reviewing \$5 meals, would love UWA to subsidise so we can get better meals but this is with them at the moment
- Bringing \$4 cereal breakfasts to cafés soon! Thank you to Barbara for her help on this!

Period Product Dispensers

- Have expressed to UWA that there is want for them in all-gender bathrooms and on College Row, however this relies on UWA's budget for this. Waiting on them at the moment. Looking to also expand to QEII hopefully.

Drug testing kits

- Unfortunately, UWA won't be supporting this, so we will be progressing with this ourselves.

Drink Spike Testing Kits

- Please, if you talk about this project, be very careful to say drink spike TESTING kits, not drink spiking kits! Very important distinction
- Progressing ourselves as well.

Guild x India

- Preliminary meetings with Nashid Chowdhury have been positive, still working out what the Guild presence will be there
- Seeking funding from UWA to kickstart this.

Guild App

- Launched! Send any feedback you have past us.

Parking

- Unfortunately, despite the dissent of Jay and I in Senate, UWA has decided to increase the daily caps to student and staff parking prices. Still working to see what improvements can be made to the physical reality of parking. Sad.

Framework for student consultation in Digital Experience Projects

- This one came out of a meeting with Karl Thompson regarding the Student Digital Experience Project Steering Group, so maybe it isn't as dry as it sounds!
- Asked what level of student consultation there had been for the inflight projects coming throughout 2026 and beyond, and there was no clear answer as they weren't aware of a framework by which students are involved in the process
- Will bring this to the next full Student Digital Experience Project Steering Group meeting, and proceed from there. Waiting to see what they progress with.

Timetabling reform

- Have discussed with Student Life, needs checking where this has progressed to.

Blue Tree Project

- Raised with Student Life, waiting to hear back about where this was up to within UWA.

Free condoms

- Ordering these to begin in sem 1!

Free HIV self-tests

- Beginning the planning for the implementation of a free HIV self-test dispenser in UWA.
- Some concerns over data privacy.

Venture

- Chloe has some updates about this, look at her report. I'm not sure what is confidential and what isn't, but for a general summary, we want Venture to grow bigger and better, and expand their offering to more students!! Lots of planning in progress here.

AI

- Academic Conduct Essentials has been updated with content regarding AI
- Looking into training through the libraries on AI

NUS Presidents' Summit Report

6/2/2026

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SUMMARY

Overall, I went in with low expectations for my very first in-person engagement with the NUS and left mildly surprised in the positive direction! I think at the very least, meeting other campus presidents and office bearers provided some perspective on how issues are perceived and felt at other campuses, and has brought me new joy for the protection of 50% SSAF in WA. Additionally, learning about the planned national-level campaigns brought some great insight into how to run campaigns on campus and some strategic guidance as to what to focus on as well.

SESSIONS

Environmental OB

The current campaign focuses this year are around the cost and accessibility of public transport, divestment from fossil fuels, running beach clean ups (with a special shoutout and reference to our own Julia Suffell on this one!). Some key points to focus on for us at UWA will be the divestment campaigns, I think if we could see ourselves following in Monash's footsteps I would be very glad!

Small & Regional Campuses OB

Heavy focus on consistency between regional & main campuses in terms of course offerings, as well as mental health, loneliness, and clubs and societies in the regions. I believe they plan to visit in March, so hopefully they can offer us some helpful advice on how to best sort out Guild India and also help Albany and other regional UWA students!

Disabilities OB

Really great presentation from Mia Williams (she/they) about their campaigns this year! Already spoken to Blake regarding getting in contact, they have a lot of passion to lend to our campaigns here at UWA. Ran us through the disability action group, which helps them seek broader feedback of people with a range of lived experiences. Campaigning on improving Disability Access and Inclusion Plans to enshrine HyFlex into them this year as they are reviewed coming out of covid. Also keen on improving signage to ensure that they are dynamic to reflect changes to circumstances, and making signage external for visibility. Discussed the masking bloc campaign to see people more able and comfortable when immunocompromised to go outdoors, which would be amazing to see at UWA as well (see Usyd DiSco).

NUS President

Focusing on repealing the Jobs-Ready Graduate program as it drives up course fees and makes arts degrees vastly more expensive than many counterparts. Looking at really driving this, and thinking it would be good to tie into our own campus by reaching out to contacts in the government to push back against this. Also, a big focus on VSU, and the importance of protecting our student unions freedoms. A lot of work to go into combatting all forms of racism on campus particularly with the Racism@Uni report out now. This is one that is super important to be on top of in our own UWA context, to address it wholly and expeditiously in the light of recent attacks especially. I was very pleasantly surprised by Felix – he seems thoroughly competent and has a great focus on increasing the operational and supportive functions of the NUS where he can.

FYA Campaign training

This really helped me solidify and understand the differences between the strategies and the tactics of a campaign, which I feel is very important to think about when considering how to action change in a university context. Additionally raised some very new ways of thinking about persuasive campaigning which I will be implementing into daily practice in university meetings! Some key points included how to comprehensively build a campaign, including a runthrough of contacting the media and how to do this strategically. If you're interested in what they had to offer, please ask, it was very informative!

Ethnocultural OB

Loved hearing from Syed, who I've had very pleasant contact with last year in his campus president role. His big focuses will be around pushing to implement the recommendations of the Racism@Uni report, responding to the Royal Commission on Antisemitism, and pushing a BDS campaign. I'm excited to link up with him to see how he can help us with his knowledge of the WA context!

International OB

Really passionate officebearer, it was great to see her focus on promoting both some smaller, community-building activities that really help foster a sense of connection with the department as well as some broader, impactful initiatives like reviewing the financial transparency of VISA fees, advocating against tuition inflation and auditing that to provide a data backing, and pushing for fair and equitable rights for international students.

Council of Australian Postgraduate Associations

Jesse and Ricky are fantastic, they are both about as qualified as can be with more post-nominals than you can shake a stick at! They are passionate about protect SSAF for unions, improving the RTP stipend to reflect

minimum wage and making it tax-free income, expanding the paid placements program to all mandatory placements, and collecting data on WIL units to support their claims to pay students a reasonable wage. Great to see us postgrads get represented by such a passionate, intelligent group of people!

NTEU

EBA bargaining is up this year, will be tying into NTEU on our campus to support the staff through that process. Definitely a focus on protecting staff after massive wage theft incidents and giving staff job security, it's good to know that Marc Tennant is working a lot on improving this very proactively on our campus with the adjunct professors! Also working to improve and reduce class sizes, to help both staff and students.

CONCLUSION AND DISCUSSION POINTS

Overall, I learned a great deal about the broader context that universities operate in, and the mixed views on a variety of government policy. Additionally, I saw how poorly some unions are treated by their university and the governments over east, so I am glad to have a working relationship with UWA that puts me in a great deal of meetings where my voice is heard, even if it seems like too many sometimes! Learnt a great deal about benchmarking and have some fantastic new contacts to ask about the situations outside of our isolated WA, so I am very glad for the trip. It was lovely to see Rama Sugiarta (UWA OGC, WA State Branch President NUS) in his element amongst the NUS, leading the way for the other state branch presidents on the operational and advocacy side. I found my first engagement with the NUS to be relatively productive, and I recommend that the 114th Guild President attend the summit. Notably, we didn't suffer the same delays as the National Conference, which I was glad for.

PROJECT UPDATE

Platinum Tickets

- We launched the Platinum Tickets at O-Day with 1494 handed out to freshers which is 300 more than last year!
- This initiative was an expansion on the Golden Tickets from last year allowing fresher's to redeem it for a club membership OR credit to an event – with clubs getting the full \$10 regardless.

- So far I've received positive feedback and am hopeful this will help to further boost engagement with clubs as well as financially bolster clubs to put on great events throughout the year.
- These Platinum Tickets will continue to be given out to fresher's who didn't redeem theirs on O-Day until September and can be used at Club Carnivals, O-Day 2 or however a club determines.

New Guild Website

- This is a long, ongoing process but it's coming along slowly!
- The new online clubs portal is getting closer to being properly launched which will allow clubs to do a lot of their activities virtually, including banking. Just sorting some final IT/access technicalities but it should hopefully be ready soon.
- From there a new EMP system will be set up to take EMPs off the Guild website, clearing up a lot of the lag issues with both EMPs and the website.
- Once all that's done and launched successfully we will be able to start the process of building a new, simpler website!

Guild App

- The Guild App has launched and gone wide for O-Day with over 900 downloads so far!
- Will be monitoring usage over the coming months and investigating deals we can do with the commercial team to benefit students.
- I've reached out to Olivia Gallagher (Head of Nursing Program) and am looking into a deals we can offer the new nursing students when they have their first week(s) on the Nedlands Campus at the Nedlands Café to welcome them and also engage them with the app and café!

Hygiene Hub

- After the success of the essential products packs last year and Food for Fines as well, I'm investigating ways we can continue to support students in the Cost of Living crisis!
- I'm starting to work on developing a hygiene hub and will be reaching out to Lizzie Moorhouse and the Student Assist team to develop and distribute hygiene packs.
- Might see if there's a way it can be tied into the Food for Fines (like allowing the \$25 donation to include a hygiene product as well) but unsure at this time – still investigating.
- Hoping to figure out this initiative more comprehensively and sus if its more appropriate as a one time distribution or a rolling basis. Will provide more details next month!

Public Transport Relief

- The Cost of Living crisis is hitting students hard, as is the crisis of finding parking!
- I'm looking into ways we can try to relieve this impact by providing credits for Smartriders. Unsure exactly how this will look as of now but I'm setting up a meeting with Lizzie Moorhouse to discuss GSC logistics.
- I've also reached out to Nicole Smith from Student Life to set me a meeting with Fiona McAuliffe to see what holisitic support and collaboration the Guild and Student Life can do on this front and whether we might be able to do this in a joint venture.

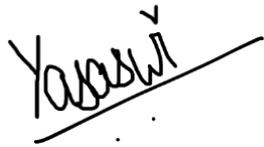

Upcoming Events – We have a couple of events planned in collaboration with UniGames over the next month, we are planning to bring back a weekly community event in the Access room to help build community at UWA. Additionally we have an accessible event for freshers planned for Wednesday week 3.

The past month or so I have been using my position as Guild Councillor to fight to build and grow the Palestine movement and end the complicity of our government and our Universities with the genocide in Palestine.

I helped to organise, build, promote and then chaired a rally against the police brutality displayed against protestors in NSW. When the war criminal and Israeli president Isaac Herzog was toured around Australia, the red carpet was rolled for him by the Australian Labour Party. On the other hand, anti-war, anti-genocide protestors were brutalised and assaulted in the streets, for the crime of protesting a war criminal.

It's clear that Australian politics is becoming more violent and brutal. There is an extreme rise in Islamophobia, paired with the insurgent popularity of Pauline Hanson's One Nation in the polls—reaching up to 27% in popularity and leading in the polls in Victoria. Pauline Hanson said on Sky News that there were “no good Muslims”. The Lakemba Mosque was sent a letter with violent threats, which was openly linked to the pro-Palestine movement through references to prominent pro-Palestine activist Josh Lees. There are countless stories of Muslim people being harassed on the streets and assaulted by racists who are emboldened and confident due to the extreme racism which is being legitimized and normalised by the far-right.

In a moment where the far-right is growing, we need to build uncompromising left-wing politics to fight it.

PSA Volunteering Program

No major updates on this front. Still figuring out exactly what we want this to look like as of now. I am currently in the process of setting up a meeting with Julia and Ethan to discuss this further and get a better idea of the types of activities/skills and ideas that might be useful for such a program.

Speeches to Postgraduate Students

Thanks to my Engagements VP, Alyssa, I am slated to give a few speeches to postgraduate cohorts in the coming weeks about the PSA, what we do and how we can better support postgraduate students. I'm speaking to the St Cats Postgraduate Cohort and at the School of Biomedical Sciences Welcome Event. I hope these speeches will help PSA better engage with the cohort and also increase our visibility as a Department that people can come to for help.

Engaging the QEII Campus

As I mentioned in my last report, it has been flagged to me that the Guild, including the PSA, has really neglected students on the QEII campus – despite them paying SSAF fees and being entitled to the same rights as 'main' campus students. My team and I therefore got brainstorming about how we can combat this and support QEII students and have been making progress.

WAMSS and SBMS are also agreeing to promote our events to help engage their cohorts with the PSA! In addition of course to the orientation speech I'm giving at QEII.

PSA Promotions

Something I've been contemplating a lot is that the PSA does a lot of great things to help students and give them social connections but struggles with visibility sometimes. In response to this Alyssa and her Engagements team have organised for our events to be promoted to postgraduate residents at both St Catherine's College and University Hall, as well as our events being promoted by WAMSS and the School of Biomedical Sciences to their members. I think this kind of partnership is really beneficial and will hopefully engage some underengaged cohorts.

PSA Survey

Massive shoutout to Hunter and Max on this front. I drafted a survey a few weeks ago and sourced their feedback which has been tremendously helpful! We are set to launch the PSA Survey this week with prizes to encourage participation. From there we will continue some communications for a while until we feel we've got an appropriate amount of data to prepare a report, both to guide our actions and also help our advocacy to the University. Keen to provide an update in March/April.

Guild on the Green and O-Day

PSA held stalls at both Guild on the Green and O-Day to much success! A huge thanks to Max, Kai and Hunter who set up and mostly ran the PSA Stall at Guild on the Green whilst I came from a meeting and got dunked in the dunk tank. They talked to various students and we got some good insight into what students want to see from us this year.

Furthermore, we held our O-Day stall to much success as well. We gained over 200 Instagram followers and had lots of fun giving out prizes like shirts, pens, stubby holders, and snacks. It was good to meet so many postgraduate students who are passionate about studying here at UWA and I hope to be able to continue to engage with them throughout my term. Massive thanks to Alyssa, Max, Kai, Hunter, Arya, Aalim, Kaaviya, Rachel, Anto and Jasper for helping out on the day!

Meeting with FacSoc and Club Leaders

Have mostly finished meeting with relevant FacSoc and Club Presidents. I really enjoyed my discussions with all of them and got a lot of good insight into the needs of their cohorts and the different ways we can support them. Some need it more than others but these meetings were very helpful none the less. Still have to meet with the UEC President so should hopefully set that up in the coming weeks but otherwise this project is mostly complete!

University Club Engagement

I met with Brad and Nicole from UniClub to go through various different topics and setup what will be a key relationship for the PSA throughout my term. We discussed multiple different things like the PSA's usage of the Club's facilities, educational/career programs we can collaborate on, and how I can best contribute my voice and knowledge to the Club! In that meeting I was also able to secure a 50% discounted UniClub Membership for postgraduate students to celebrate O-Week! I was grateful to Brad and Nicole for this collaborative effort which is available until the middle of March. I hope this is the start of a fruitful relationship between UniClub and the PSA in 2026.

PSA Committee

The PSA Committee held our first Committee meeting for the year at the beginning of February. It was nice to meet everyone in person and discuss the opportunities and ideas everyone had for the year. I'm currently in the process of organising our next meeting and also organising some committee bonding! Was grateful that many showed up to help out for O-Day as well. Additionally, I will be reaching out to the School of Indigenous Studies to find a postgraduate representative and will re-open applications for the final two research rep positions now that O-Week is over.

PSA Newsletter

I am currently working through the final design of it but the general gist of the Newsletter will be a welcome from me, some information about our initiatives (i.e. nappies in parents rooms), upcoming events, promo for the PSA Survey and then will include some events being run but different postgraduate faculties or researchers on their request. Over the course of the Semester I'll also use the newsletter to highlight and introduce each one of my executive members just so as many postgrads as possible know who to come to for help.
