- 13.1** The 113th Guild Council:

13.1.1 Endorses the National Day of Action on the 17th of September against Pauline Hanson, which is organised by the National Union of Students.

13.1.2 Notes that the previous National Day of Action on the 13th of August was extremely successful, with over 15,000 students coming out across Australia to attend it, and around 2,000 in WA; and that it was the largest and most significant display of public opposition against the far-right in Australia since the high-school walk-outs in the 1990s.
