PROJECT UPDATE

University advocacy/feedback

- **Generative AI Committee:** feedback on AI framework for the university and the ethical staff usage guidelines. Also a big focus on upskilling students properly which is nice
- **University Strategic Enterprise Education Council:** feedback on experiential learning model/policies, AI 2030 strategy, other currently offered WIL programs, alongside Integrated Professional degrees
- **Student Digital Experience Program Steering Group:** advocating for prioritisation of timetabling system, increased student consultation throughout all digital experience projects. Timetabling is in initial stages now.
- **University Curriculum & Admission Standards Committee:** feedback on new proposed courses, focusing on following University policy to protect students
- **Safer Communities Advisory Committee:** co-chairing this meeting, and working on a big schedule of works to advocate for students & improve safety/equity on campus
- **Board of Studies, Life Health & Natural Sciences:** providing student feedback on new courses and methods of progression within LHNS
- **Convocation Council:** working together with our alumni council to advertise initiatives, look for funding, and generally improve the student experience
- **SSAF Committee:** making sure our SSAF money is spent on the right things
- **Review of Assessment Working Group:** fighting against all scary things for students like barrier exams, changes to assessment that worsen equity issues & pedagogy. Also working on improving the feedback students receive on assessments, capping exams at 50%, and mandating practice papers for exams!
- **Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Operations):** enabling students to use big university venues like Winthrop & Octagon at an affordable price/free, implementing sharps bins around campus for student safety, improving accessibility of Cameron Hall & Guild Offices, activating outdoor spaces, and putting a multifaith room in around QEII/ALVA. Sharps bins are being put in soon, a good win for students!
- **Libraries:** working on 24/7 BJ, unfortunately they've made the decision to limit law library hours away from 24/7 (good to know that 97% of current usage sits within the new hours that they've changed it to, but still sad). Also bringing feedback around EDFAA Library works disrupting students.
- **Academic Integrity Policy Review:** giving lots of feedback on proposed changes, this is a longggg review been to 6 different meetings now. Final version has come for consultation and it is much improved from the previous for students!!

Guild Master Plan update

- Reviewing TRCB documents to look at feasibility of restructuring how the Guild flows from the GSC to the offices, to look at a new lift near the GSC.
- \$2.4 million secured for the lift and works, very excited!

Platinum Tickets

- Launched during O'Week 1! Over 2000 distributed.
- More out in Sem 2!!!

NUS Engagement

- Been in contact with the new NUS President Felix Hughes, who visited UWA in February
- Also been in contact with our new State Branch President, Rama Sugiartha (congrats!)
- Went to the Presidents' Summit, learnt lots. See individual report.
- Went to Education Conference, got shouted at by socialists! So fun.

Food for Fines

- Running this year in the months of March and August!
- Now in second one!!

Period Product Dispensers

- Have expressed to UWA that there is want for them in all-gender bathrooms and on College Row, however this relies on UWA's budget for this. Waiting on them at the moment. Trying to get this built into ongoing budget as an equity initiative rather than a cost of living initiative so that it won't run out!

Drug testing kits

- Unfortunately, UWA won't be supporting this, so we will be progressing with this ourselves.
- Contact with SEN about these

Drink Spike Testing Kits

- Please, if you talk about this project, be very careful to say drink spike TESTING kits, not drink spiking kits! Very important distinction
- Progressing ourselves as well.
- Marketing campaign is out and lots of media interest – reel filmed, and other associated material has been produced
- Well done to everyone helping with this one!

Guild x India

- Preliminary meetings with Nashid Chowdhury have been positive, still working out what the Guild presence will be there
- Seeking funding from UWA to kickstart this.
- Progressing with a Memorandum of Understanding with them

Guild App

- Launched! Send any feedback you have past us.
- Working on more features now

Framework for student consultation in Digital Experience Projects

- This one came out of a meeting with Karl Thompson regarding the Student Digital Experience Project Steering Group, so maybe it isn't as dry as it sounds!
- Asked what level of student consultation there had been for the inflight projects coming throughout 2026 and beyond, and there was no clear answer as they weren't aware of a framework by which students are involved in the process
- Have continued discussions around the best model to use for this. Parked while money is worked out.

- Unfortunately the money didn't come through for the position, so progressing through more informal methods.

Timetabling reform

- Have discussed with Student Life, waiting on the beginning of the program starting up with funding. It's going to take a while this one – they're working on it but slowly.

Blue Tree Project

- Raised with Student Life, got in contact with the founder of the project who's a UWA alumni, progressing discussions to campus management now.

Free condoms

- Out in the GSC! YAY! Also getting 30,000 across the colleges.

Venture

- Chloe has some updates about this, look at her report. I'm not sure what is confidential and what isn't, but for a general summary, we want Venture to grow bigger and better, and expand their offering to more students!! Lots of planning in progress here.

AI

- Academic Conduct Essentials has been updated with content regarding AI
- Looking into training through the libraries on AI
- Feedback being given in Generative AI committee on high level policy to protect students, train them better, and also make sure that staff are held to account too.
- Guidelines for ethical staff usage have been passed by Academic Board, monitoring the implementation now.

Guild Culture

Unpaid Placement Financial Hardship Grant

- Connecting with AMSA and WAMSS to get some WA data on the impact of unpaid placements on students, and writing letters to ministers to advocate to expand the Commonwealth Prac Payment scheme to more allied health fields

- Connected with WAMSS and Lifeblood to coordinate a whole-of-UWA blood drive!
- This is ongoing, get out there and get your blood flowing for it.
- Can be recognised as volunteer hours while you do it!

VISA Fee Advocacy

- Statement made
- Motion passed in Guild Council against the increases
- Spoke to a motion in the City of Perth Council

PROSH Policy Change

- Discovered that the policy didn't extend to cover assessments, only classes – thank you Ed Council!
- Advocated to change this to extend the policy to cover assessments

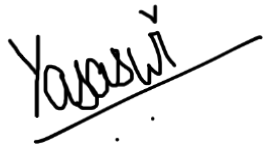

ISD Room - Since the ISD Room doesn't have swipe cards/key cards, Juvincia (ISD Welfare Director) and the committee are trying our best to have at least one of us present from 12:00pm -4:30pm where international students can come destress, have snacks, study or play switch! We also held our first event in ISD Room – Crafty Connections which was well attended.

Advocacy on recent Temporary Graduate Visa (Subclass 485) price increase – Released a statement from Guild, PSA and ISD to show our support and call on reversal which received over 3000 likes and 220 reposts. Thanks to Jay and Ollie for helping on it. Also, attended the City of Perth Council meeting to raise the issue and talk on the matter/calling for reversal of this decision alongside Yasaswi, Emma, Jay and Ollie

Organizing legal/immigration advisory sessions – The visa and migration seminar was on 24th March, in collaboration with P MEC (Pathway Migration & Education Consultants). Was successful with many international students attending, learning and winning merch too

Paints n' Pebbles – Event on 17th March in Matilda Bay where students can come along, destress and mingle and connect with others. Over 40 attendees and created a relaxed, welcoming space for students to socialize.

International alumni panels – I've had a chat with Mary Portez from UWA Industry Engagement (Careers). Still in planning stage, hopefully will run one event in Semester 2. In talks with ISD Education Director and how we want to plan this out and stakeholders. The main idea of this event is to connect international students and graduates, sharing their experience, insights, and pathways beyond university.

Ramadan Welfare Pack – Alongside Ethno and ISD collaboration on Ramadan information video, we gave out dates and water pack on Harmony Day from ISD Stall aiming to support individuals who were fasting by providing simple items traditionally used to break the fast at iftar.

Lunar New Year - The event successfully ran on Tuesday, 24 February, from 11:00am to 2:00pm at Oak Lawn. We had performances like Lion Dance, Kpop Dance, Vpop Dance, Jpop Dance, Asian drumming, live Guzheng performance, martial arts and tai chi performances. On the University front, August also included consultation on UWA's draft DEI Strategy 2026–2030, continued work around graduate attributes, career readiness and transferable skills, and consideration of several education and student policy reforms. Academic Council also progressed changes to micro-credentials and student support policies and approved a number of new and revised postgrad courses for 2027.

PSA has also had a strong start to Semester 2. Our first PSA Connect brought postgraduates together at the Tavern, Semester 2 Grants and Awards are now open, and the PSA Survey report is nearing publication and circulation to University leadership. We're also refreshing the PSA Common Room and developing a new PSA Welfare Connect to create a more accessible, low-barrier space for postgraduates to connect, study and seek support. Alongside stalls at Pride and Enviro/Volunteering Fest and plenty of other engagement across campus, there's lots happening as we head into the final stretch of the term.

PROJECT UPDATE

PSA Grants

Semester 2 PSA Grants and Awards are now open, with applications closing on 7 September. These grants provide financial support and recognition for postgraduate students undertaking research, professional development and other academic activities. I'm looking forward to reading this semester's applications and supporting another strong group of recipients. Angus has now settled into the Grants and Awards Officer role and will be coordinating the application and assessment process for the round!

PSA Common Room Cleanup

The PSA is undertaking a refresh of the PSA Common Room, led by Welfare VP Tushaal. The space is currently in need of some attention but has significant potential as a functional and welcoming space for postgrad students. The team will be cleaning, tidying and rearranging the room to make it more comfortable for everyday postgraduate use, while also creating a space that can better accommodate smaller PSA events and activities. Once the refresh is complete, we'll promote the space more widely to ensure postgrads know it is available to them.

PSA Welfare Connect

We are also developing a new PSA Welfare Connect, which will be held in the refreshed PSA Common Room. Unlike our larger social PSA Connect events, Welfare Connect will provide a more relaxed and low-barrier environment where postgraduate students can drop in, study, unwind, chat with other students or discuss any issues they may be experiencing with the PSA team. The aim is to create an accessible and supportive space where students can connect with us and each other without needing to attend a formal appointment or large social event.

PSA Connect

The first PSA Connect of Semester 2 was held at the UWA Tavern and was a great start to the semester. It was fantastic to see postgraduate students coming along, meeting new people and reconnecting with friends over free pizza and drinks. There was strong engagement throughout the evening and it was particularly nice to see students making use of the event as a space to build connections within the postgrad community. Our next PSA Connect will be a collaboration with SLAC!

PSA Survey

The PSA Survey report has now been sent to Robyn and Mike, who are finalising the design ahead of its publication and circulation. A briefing note has also been drafted for the report to be considered by the Learning and Teaching Committee and has been sent to the Pro Vice-Chancellor (Academic) to seek her sponsorship. This will be an important opportunity to ensure the findings and priorities identified by postgraduate students are formally considered within University decision-making.

The final report is expected to be published online in the coming weeks, potentially alongside the launch of the new Guild website. Once published, it will also provide a useful resource for the PSA's ongoing advocacy and engagement with the University.

Pride and Enviro/Volunteering Fest Stalls

The PSA ran stalls at both the Pride Festival and Environment and Volunteering Festival, providing fun opportunities for postgraduate students to engage with the PSA and connect with the wider campus community. The Pride Festival stall featured bracelet making, while the Environment and Volunteering Festival included leaf painting and other activities. Both were great opportunities to increase the PSA's visibility on campus and engage with students in a relaxed and welcoming environment.

ENGAGEMENT WITH THE UNIVERSITY

Review of Assessment Working Group Special Meeting

Attended a special meeting of the Review of Assessment Working Group, focused exclusively on UWA's proposed new Assessment Assurance Policy. The policy responds to the changing assessment environment,

particularly generative AI, and would require all weighted assessments to have reasonable assurance of student authorship. Key proposals include requiring at least two primary assessment types per unit and either at least 50% secure assessment or a secure hurdle worth at least 30% covering all unit learning outcomes.

I raised significant concerns about the student impact of the proposed framework, particularly the increased use of secure and hurdle assessments and the consequences for students who achieve an overall passing mark but fail a hurdle. While some safeguards have been included around the use of hurdles, I remain concerned that the policy risks creating unnecessarily high-stakes and inflexible assessment structures. The policy is now progressing to the University Education Committee, where I plan to speak against its approval.

Alumni Council

Attended the August meeting of the UWA Convocation Alumni Council. Key discussions included the future of Convocation's undergraduate awards, progress on the Council's Strategic Plan, establishment of the new UWA Community Recognition and Awards Committee, and development of a refreshed Convocation visual identity. Ollie and I provided updates from the Guild and Senate (alongside Cheryl and David), including on the UWA India campuses, international and HDR enrolments, student accommodation, and the broader financial environment facing the University.

Council discussed strengthening collaboration between Convocation, the University and Development and Alumni Relations as its new Strategic Plan develops, particularly given resource constraints and potential changes across the WA university sector. We also received encouraging data on growing engagement with Convocation's website, with awards and scholarships continuing to attract particularly strong interest!

University Education Committee

Attended the August UEC meeting, with key discussions focused on UWA's assessment reform agenda, revised Graduate Attributes, graduate employment outcomes, career readiness and transferable skills. The Committee also considered a new University-wide categorisation of assessment types, endorsed further development of UWA's Career Registration and Transferable Skills Taxonomy, and progressed several new and revised education and student policies, including the Student Participation and Practice Policy.

The proposed Assessment Assurance Policy generated significant discussion. I spoke against the policy in its current form, particularly the proposed secure and hurdle assessment requirements and the potentially significant consequences for students who fail a hurdle despite otherwise passing a unit. Pleasingly, the Committee agreed not to progress the policy to Academic Board at this stage, instead requiring further consultation and revisions addressing hurdle assessments, secure assessment thresholds, workload, verification requirements and student impact before it returns to UEC.

Academic Council

Attended the August Academic Council meeting, which considered a range of education and curriculum matters. Council approved revised frameworks for micro-credentials and continuing and professional education, reviewed undergraduate course performance through the Mandatory Continuous Course Monitoring process, and approved the updated Support for Students Policy, including new arrangements for UWA India. Discussion on student support also highlighted the importance of using retention, completion, attrition and other student data to assess how effectively support mechanisms are working.

Council also approved several significant changes to UWA's postgraduate course offerings from 2027, including new Masters degrees in Statistics and Semiconductor Science and Technology, a Graduate Certificate in Agricultural Engineering Innovation, and a restructure of postgraduate Law offerings. The

Master of Business Information and Logistics Management was also renamed the Master of Information Systems & Supply Chains to better reflect its contemporary academic and industry focus.

PROJECT UPDATE

University advocacy/feedback

- **Generative AI Committee:** feedback on AI framework for the university and the ethical staff usage guidelines. Also a big focus on upskilling students properly which is nice
- **University Strategic Enterprise Education Council:** feedback on experiential learning model/policies, AI 2030 strategy, other currently offered WIL programs, alongside Integrated Professional degrees
- **Student Digital Experience Program Steering Group:** advocating for prioritisation of timetabling system, increased student consultation throughout all digital experience projects. Timetabling is in initial stages now.
- **University Curriculum & Admission Standards Committee:** feedback on new proposed courses, focusing on following University policy to protect students
- **Safer Communities Advisory Committee:** co-chairing this meeting, and working on a big schedule of works to advocate for students & improve safety/equity on campus
- **Board of Studies, Life Health & Natural Sciences:** providing student feedback on new courses and methods of progression within LHNS
- **Convocation Council:** working together with our alumni council to advertise initiatives, look for funding, and generally improve the student experience
- **SSAF Committee:** making sure our SSAF money is spent on the right things
- **Review of Assessment Working Group:** fighting against all scary things for students like barrier exams, changes to assessment that worsen equity issues & pedagogy. Also working on improving the feedback students receive on assessments, capping exams at 50%, and mandating practice papers for exams!
- **Deputy Vice-Chancellor (Operations):** enabling students to use big university venues like Winthrop & Octagon at an affordable price/free, implementing sharps bins around campus for student safety, improving accessibility of Cameron Hall & Guild Offices, activating outdoor spaces, and putting a multifaith room in around QEII/ALVA. Sharps bins are being put in soon, a good win for students!
- **Libraries:** working on 24/7 BJ, unfortunately they've made the decision to limit law library hours away from 24/7 (good to know that 97% of current usage sits within the new hours that they've changed it to, but still sad). Also bringing feedback around EDFAA Library works disrupting students.
- **Academic Integrity Policy Review:** giving lots of feedback on proposed changes, this is a longggg review been to 6 different meetings now. Final version has come for consultation and it is much improved from the previous for students!!

Guild Master Plan update

- Reviewing TRCB documents to look at feasibility of restructuring how the Guild flows from the GSC to the offices, to look at a new lift near the GSC.

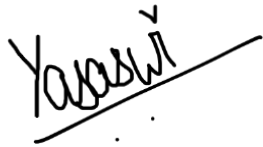

Thanks to Jay and Ollie for helping on it. Also, attended the City of Perth Council meeting to raise the issue and talk on the matter/calling for reversal of this decision alongside Yasaswi, Emma, Jay and Ollie

Organizing legal/immigration advisory sessions – The visa and migration seminar was on 24th March, in collaboration with P MEC (Pathway Migration & Education Consultants). Was successful with many international students attending, learning and winning merch too

Paints n' Pebbles – Event on 17th March in Matilda Bay where students can come along, destress and mingle and connect with others. Over 40 attendees and created a relaxed, welcoming space for students to socialize.

International alumni panels – I've had a chat with Mary Portez from UWA Industry Engagement (Careers). Still in planning stage, hopefully will run one event in Semester 2. In talks with ISD Education Director and how we want to plan this out and stakeholders. The main idea of this event is to connect international students and graduates, sharing their experience, insights, and pathways beyond university.

Ramadan Welfare Pack – Alongside Ethno and ISD collaboration on Ramadan information video, we gave out dates and water pack on Harmony Day from ISD Stall aiming to support individuals who were fasting by providing simple items traditionally used to break the fast at iftar.

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SUMMARY

August has been another busy month across both University representation and PSA activities. I continued representing postgrad students across a wide range of University and Guild committees, including Senate, University Education Committee, Academic Council, Alumni Council and the Review of Assessment Working Group. A major focus this month was the proposed Assessment Assurance Policy, where I raised significant concerns about the increased use of secure and hurdle assessments and their potential impact on students. It was good to see these concerns reflected at UEC, with the policy sent back for further consultation and revision rather than progressing to Academic Board in its current form.

On the University front, August also included consultation on UWA's draft DEI Strategy 2026–2030, continued work around graduate attributes, career readiness and transferable skills, and consideration of several education and student policy reforms. Academic Council also progressed changes to micro-credentials and student support policies and approved a number of new and revised postgrad courses for 2027.

PSA has also had a strong start to Semester 2. Our first PSA Connect brought postgraduates together at the Tavern, Semester 2 Grants and Awards are now open, and the PSA Survey report is nearing publication and circulation to University leadership. We're also refreshing the PSA Common Room and developing a new PSA Welfare Connect to create a more accessible, low-barrier space for postgraduates to connect, study and seek support. Alongside stalls at Pride and Enviro/Volunteering Fest and plenty of other engagement across campus, there's lots happening as we head into the final stretch of the term.

PROJECT UPDATE

PSA Grants

Semester 2 PSA Grants and Awards are now open, with applications closing on 7 September. These grants provide financial support and recognition for postgraduate students undertaking research, professional development and other academic activities. I'm looking forward to reading this semester's applications and supporting another strong group of recipients. Angus has now settled into the Grants and Awards Officer role and will be coordinating the application and assessment process for the round!

PSA Common Room Cleanup

The PSA is undertaking a refresh of the PSA Common Room, led by Welfare VP Tushaal. The space is currently in need of some attention but has significant potential as a functional and welcoming space for postgrad students. The team will be cleaning, tidying and rearranging the room to make it more comfortable for everyday postgraduate use, while also creating a space that can better accommodate smaller PSA events and activities. Once the refresh is complete, we'll promote the space more widely to ensure postgrads know it is available to them.

PSA Welfare Connect

We are also developing a new PSA Welfare Connect, which will be held in the refreshed PSA Common Room. Unlike our larger social PSA Connect events, Welfare Connect will provide a more relaxed and low-barrier environment where postgraduate students can drop in, study, unwind, chat with other students or discuss any issues they may be experiencing with the PSA team. The aim is to create an accessible and supportive space where students can connect with us and each other without needing to attend a formal appointment or large social event.

PSA Connect

The first PSA Connect of Semester 2 was held at the UWA Tavern and was a great start to the semester. It was fantastic to see postgraduate students coming along, meeting new people and reconnecting with friends over free pizza and drinks. There was strong engagement throughout the evening and it was particularly nice to see students making use of the event as a space to build connections within the postgrad community. Our next PSA Connect will be a collaboration with SLAC!

PSA Survey

The PSA Survey report has now been sent to Robyn and Mike, who are finalising the design ahead of its publication and circulation. A briefing note has also been drafted for the report to be considered by the Learning and Teaching Committee and has been sent to the Pro Vice-Chancellor (Academic) to seek her sponsorship. This will be an important opportunity to ensure the findings and priorities identified by postgraduate students are formally considered within University decision-making.

The final report is expected to be published online in the coming weeks, potentially alongside the launch of the new Guild website. Once published, it will also provide a useful resource for the PSA's ongoing advocacy and engagement with the University.

Pride and Enviro/Volunteering Fest Stalls

The PSA ran stalls at both the Pride Festival and Environment and Volunteering Festival, providing fun opportunities for postgraduate students to engage with the PSA and connect with the wider campus community. The Pride Festival stall featured bracelet making, while the Environment and Volunteering Festival included leaf painting and other activities. Both were great opportunities to increase the PSA's visibility on campus and engage with students in a relaxed and welcoming environment.

ENGAGEMENT WITH THE UNIVERSITY

Review of Assessment Working Group Special Meeting

Attended a special meeting of the Review of Assessment Working Group, focused exclusively on UWA's proposed new Assessment Assurance Policy. The policy responds to the changing assessment environment,

particularly generative AI, and would require all weighted assessments to have reasonable assurance of student authorship. Key proposals include requiring at least two primary assessment types per unit and either at least 50% secure assessment or a secure hurdle worth at least 30% covering all unit learning outcomes.

I raised significant concerns about the student impact of the proposed framework, particularly the increased use of secure and hurdle assessments and the consequences for students who achieve an overall passing mark but fail a hurdle. While some safeguards have been included around the use of hurdles, I remain concerned that the policy risks creating unnecessarily high-stakes and inflexible assessment structures. The policy is now progressing to the University Education Committee, where I plan to speak against its approval.

Alumni Council

Attended the August meeting of the UWA Convocation Alumni Council. Key discussions included the future of Convocation's undergraduate awards, progress on the Council's Strategic Plan, establishment of the new UWA Community Recognition and Awards Committee, and development of a refreshed Convocation visual identity. Ollie and I provided updates from the Guild and Senate (alongside Cheryl and David), including on the UWA India campuses, international and HDR enrolments, student accommodation, and the broader financial environment facing the University.

Council discussed strengthening collaboration between Convocation, the University and Development and Alumni Relations as its new Strategic Plan develops, particularly given resource constraints and potential changes across the WA university sector. We also received encouraging data on growing engagement with Convocation's website, with awards and scholarships continuing to attract particularly strong interest!

University Education Committee

Attended the August UEC meeting, with key discussions focused on UWA's assessment reform agenda, revised Graduate Attributes, graduate employment outcomes, career readiness and transferable skills. The Committee also considered a new University-wide categorisation of assessment types, endorsed further development of UWA's Career Registration and Transferable Skills Taxonomy, and progressed several new and revised education and student policies, including the Student Participation and Practice Policy.

The proposed Assessment Assurance Policy generated significant discussion. I spoke against the policy in its current form, particularly the proposed secure and hurdle assessment requirements and the potentially significant consequences for students who fail a hurdle despite otherwise passing a unit. Pleasingly, the Committee agreed not to progress the policy to Academic Board at this stage, instead requiring further consultation and revisions addressing hurdle assessments, secure assessment thresholds, workload, verification requirements and student impact before it returns to UEC.

Academic Council

Attended the August Academic Council meeting, which considered a range of education and curriculum matters. Council approved revised frameworks for micro-credentials and continuing and professional education, reviewed undergraduate course performance through the Mandatory Continuous Course Monitoring process, and approved the updated Support for Students Policy, including new arrangements for UWA India. Discussion on student support also highlighted the importance of using retention, completion, attrition and other student data to assess how effectively support mechanisms are working.

Council also approved several significant changes to UWA's postgraduate course offerings from 2027, including new Masters degrees in Statistics and Semiconductor Science and Technology, a Graduate Certificate in Agricultural Engineering Innovation, and a restructure of postgraduate Law offerings. The

Master of Business Information and Logistics Management was also renamed the Master of Information Systems & Supply Chains to better reflect its contemporary academic and industry focus.
